Matt 13:44

- We cannot find the kingdom. 1 Cor 2:14 “The natural man...”. We don’t find the kingdom.
- We don’t hide the kingdom. You can hide the light within you (Matt 5:15 lamp under a bushel), but you can’t hide the entire kingdom. It is much bigger than you.
- We can’t buy the kingdom. It isn’t for sale and even if it was we couldn’t afford it.

Luke 15:4-5 "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing.

Therefore, the Bible answer to our first question is: At the core, what God delights in in His people is that we delight in Him.

The proper reason to be glad that God delights in our delight in Him is because it confirms that our delight is truly in God. This fixes our gaze more steadfastly on Him and deepens our joy in Him.

HERE'S THE DANGER! What if we hear God's praise and are drawn away from delighting in God to delighting in God's delighting in us?

God demonstrated His love for you in that while you were a sinner Jesus died for you. He sought you, He bought you, He hid you in Himself, He gave you His Holy Spirit, He delights in you. None can snatch you away!
